



REMINDER TIDBITS

Every now and then it is a good idea to be reminded of certain basic standards by which we as disciples of Jesus are called to live. Consider this bulletin insert one of those occasions.

APPROPRIATE ATTIRE

Now that summer weather is upon us we have an opportunity to consider appropriate attire to be worn at Mass. And in this consideration the first point must be to address what motivates us to wear the clothing we choose. All of us have to admit we put at least a little thought into choosing what we are going to wear. If, for example, we were to go to the doctor's office for an appointment, we would expect our doctor to be wearing a white lab coat, even though that lab coat neither adds nor takes away from his or her knowledge of medicine. Who can explain what's behind that? In the same way, if a police officer were to stop us along the highway, we would expect him or her to look like a police officer. Again, who can explain why that is? There are many more examples we can imagine that compare to these two. We have to acknowledge that, somehow, clothing is our way to express externally what is going on internally. The doctor approaches the sick person with a vast amount of knowledge about health and diseases and so on. And that knowledge or attitude is communicated with just a simple lab coat. The police officer communicates to the public that he or she is an agent of security for the community by dressing in a particular way.

In just the same way there must be something reflective of our approach to God Himself in the way we dress to offer Him worship. Our external dress expresses our heart's desire to worship Him. Therefore, it is important to think about the way we dress when attending Mass. This would necessarily exclude clothing one might wear to the beach or a softball game, such as sweatpants, running shorts, flip-flop sandals, Budweiser t-shirts, and so on. If one finds this is the kind of clothing he is accustomed to wear to worship our Lord, he might take another look.

EASTER AND CHRISTMAS

These citations below from the "Catechism of the Catholic Church" make it quite clear what the expectation of the Church is regarding Sunday and holy day Mass attendance. Though anyone reading this might be considered the "choir to whom the pastor is preaching" (i.e., those who faithfully worship God in Mass attendance are the ones most likely to pick up a bulletin), it is possible you may know friends or family members who may attend Mass only occasionally.

Some people might have the mistaken notion that it is acceptable to receive Holy Communion when attending Mass infrequently without confessing this sin against the third commandment to keep the Lord's day holy. More than likely these people are not even aware of this expectation of the Church, as shown below, though one can hardly escape the clear expectation from God Himself who wants that we come to Him, not for his sake but for ours.


The Lord commands that we remove the plank from our own eye before attempting to remove the speck from our brother's eye, yet there is still no question the obligation is placed upon us in charity to care for our brother's spiritual welfare. If we know such circumstances apply to our family or friends we are called upon to present this truth in as charitable way as possible.

MISSING SUNDAY MASS IS A GRAVE SIN.

#2181 The Sunday Eucharist is the foundation and confirmation of all Christian practice. For this reason the faithful are obliged to participate in the Eucharist on days of obligation, unless excused for a serious reason (for example, illness, the care of infants) or dispensed by their own pastor. Those who deliberately fail in this obligation commit a grave sin.

One who is aware of committing a grave sin must not receive Holy Communion without first having reconciled through confession.

#1457 According to the Church's command, "after having attained the age of discretion, each of the faithful is bound by an obligation faithfully to confess serious sins at least once a year." Anyone who is aware of having committed a mortal sin must not receive Holy Communion, even if he experiences deep contrition, without having first received sacramental absolution, unless he has a grave reason for receiving Communion and there is no possibility of going to confession. Children must go to the sacrament of Penance before receiving Holy Communion for the first time.




Lincoln Marathon recommendations for Blessed Sacrament parishioners coming to Mass on May 5th:

Turn right on Antelope Creek Pkwy and travel south to O St. after 8:00 a.m. All runners will be past this spot by 8:00 a.m. so from here you can go to 13th and O St., then follow 13th to Lake St. then over to Blessed Sacrament. (See Southwest to Blessed Sacrament)

Coming from Northeast of 17th and South Street: Make your way to 17th and O St. after 8:00 a.m. All runners will be past this spot by 8:00 a.m. so from here you can go to 13th and O St., then follow 13th to Lake St. then over to Blessed Sacrament. (See North to Blessed Sacrament)

Coming from Northwest of 17th and South Street: Use 10th St. to travel North past downtown to Salt Creek Rdwy. Turn right on Salt Creek Rdwy, then go east to Antelope Valley Pkwy. Turn right on Antelope Creek Pkwy and travel south to O St. after 8:00 a.m. All runners will be past this spot by 8:00 a.m. so from here you can go to 13th and O St., then follow 13th to Lake St. then over to Blessed Sacrament. (See North to Blessed Sacrament)



Coming from Southeast of 17th and South Street: Make your way to 22nd and Van Dorn. Use 22nd to travel north to Lake Street, then west on Lake to Blessed Sacrament. (See Southeast to Blessed Sacrament)

In general, access to Blessed Sacrament will be difficult for folks to make it to your 8:30 a.m. Mass if they live south of 17th and Lake. They will need to drive north to go around the marathon course but if they wait until 8 a.m., then they should be able to get inside the course and make it to Mass. For your 10:00 a.m. Mass, I would expect full access to 17th and Lake from the north, but anyone south of the church will have to travel around the course so they approach the church from the north. Your 11:30 a.m. Mass should be open from both directions.





THIS CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT...

REMOVES PARENTAL RIGHTS

By using all "persons" instead of "women," any girl under the age of 18 could have an abortion without her parent's consent or knowledge.

GIVES ABORTIONISTS THE SOLE DISCRETION TO DECIDE VIABILITY

Women seeking an abortion don't see their OBGYN or family doctor. They go to abortion practitioners. This ballot initiative gives power to abortion practitioners, who may not even be licensed doctors, to decide whether a baby is "viable."

CREATES A RIGHT TO LATE-PREGNANCY ABORTION

Babies born as late as 32-36 weeks need machines to help them breathe. This is an "extraordinary medical measure" necessary for their life outside the womb. Under the ballot proposal language, these babies are not "viable" and may be aborted.

ARTICLE I, SECTION 31

OF THE NEBRASKA STATE CONSTITITION
SHALL BE AMENDED TO READ...

"All persons shall have a fundamental right to abortion until fetal viability, or when needed to protect the life or health of the pregnant patient, without interference from the state or its political subdivisions.

Fetal viability means the point in pregnancy when, in the professional judgment of the patient's treating health care practitioner, there is a significant likelihood of the fetus' sustained survival outside the uterus without the application of extraordinary medical measures."


