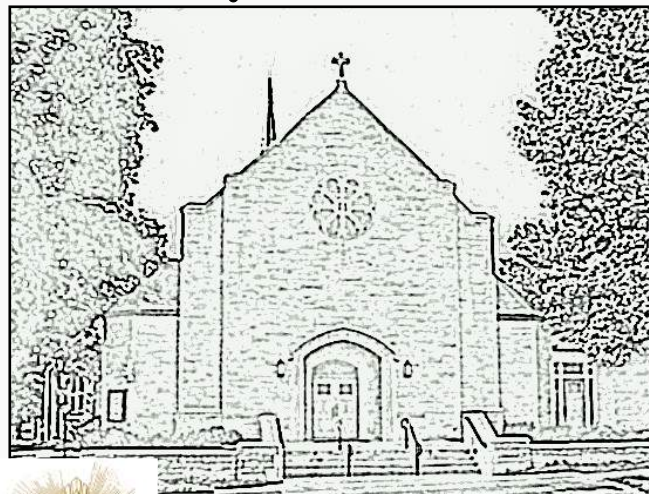

REMINDER TIDBITS

Every now and then it is a good idea to be reminded of certain basic standards by which we as disciples of Jesus are called to live. Consider this bulletin insert one of those occasions.

APPROPRIATE ATTIRE

As we think about appropriate attire for the worship of Our Lord at Mass, one refreshing reflection for us is the recent First Holy Communion held at our parish. Not only were the children beautifully attired, so were their parents and other family members who came. The important question to ask is: Why does this happen? Certainly, for children receiving Jesus in Holy Communion for the first time we see an extraordinarily important event in the child's journey to holiness. Parents and family members recognize this, and for some reason they see it as a time to dress well. Yet is it not true that what happens at a child's first Holy Communion is what happens for every one of us at every Mass? In our worship of God, Christ brings himself to us. We become one with God, who is present to us in the Eucharist, body, blood, soul, and divinity. How we approach Him does make a difference, including the external signs we convey to Him, such as our dress.

THE PRECEPTS OF THE CHURCH

(From the Catechism of the Catholic Church, #2041-43)

2041

The precepts of the Church are set in the context of a moral life bound to and nourished by liturgical life. The obligatory character of these positive laws decreed by the pastoral authorities is meant to guarantee to the faithful *the very necessary minimum in the spirit of prayer and moral effort, in the growth in love of God and neighbor* (emphasis added):

2042

The first precept ("You shall attend Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation and rest from servile labor") requires the faithful to sanctify the day commemorating the Resurrection of the Lord as well as the principal liturgical feasts honoring the mysteries of the Lord, the Blessed Virgin Mary, and the saints; in the first place, by participating in the Eucharistic celebration, in which the Christian community is gathered, and by resting from those works and activities which could impede such a sanctification of these days. (cf. Rom.12:8,11)

The second precept ("You shall confess your sins at least once a year") ensures preparation for the Eucharist by the reception of the sacrament of reconciliation, which continues Baptism's work of conversion and forgiveness.

The third precept ("You shall receive the sacrament of the Eucharist at least during the Easter season") guarantees as a minimum the reception of the Lord's Body and Blood in connection with the Paschal feasts, the origin and center of the Christian liturgy.

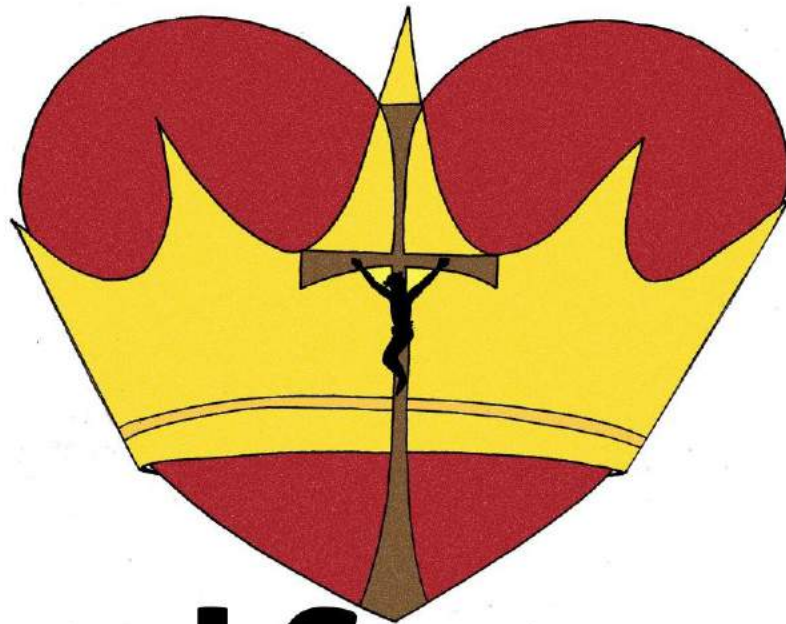

The fourth precept ("You shall observe the days of fasting and abstinence established by the Church") ensures the times of asceticism and penance which prepare us for the liturgical feasts and help us acquire mastery over our instincts and freedom of heart.

The fifth precept ("You shall help to provide for the needs of the Church") means that the faithful are obliged to assist with the material needs of the Church, each according to his own ability.

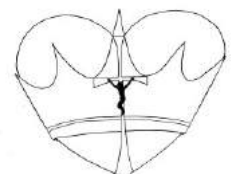

THIS CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT...

REMOVES PARENTAL RIGHTS

By using all "persons" instead of "women," any girl under the age of 18 could have an abortion without her parent's consent or knowledge.

LEAVES "HEALTH" UNDEFINED

Court cases define "health" exceptions to include emotional, psychological, and familial well-being.

THREATENS ALL HEALTH AND SAFETY REGULATIONS

The amendment risks eliminating 50 years of common-sense protections for women and girls against unsafe abortion practices. After passing a similar constitutional amendment, Michigan quickly repealed informed consent laws, and state licensing and inspection requirements for abortion facilities.

GIVES ABORTIONISTS THE SOLE DISCRETION TO DECIDE VIABILITY

Women seeking an abortion don't see their OBGYN or family doctor. They go to abortion practitioners. This ballot initiative gives power to abortion practitioners, who may not even be licensed doctors, to decide whether a baby is "viable."

CREATES A RIGHT TO LATE-PREGNANCY ABORTION

Babies born as late as 32-36 weeks need machines to help them breathe. This is an "extraordinary medical measure" necessary for their life outside the womb. Under the ballot proposal language, these babies are not "viable" and may be aborted.

ARTICLE I, SECTION 31

*OF THE NEBRASKA STATE CONSTITUTION
SHALL BE AMENDED TO READ...*

"All persons shall have a fundamental right to abortion until fetal viability, or when needed to protect the life or health of the pregnant patient, without interference from the state or its political subdivisions.

Fetal viability means the point in pregnancy when, in the professional judgment of the patient's treating health care practitioner, there is a significant likelihood of the fetus' sustained survival outside the uterus without the application of extraordinary medical measures."

Explaining the Pro-Abortion Ballot Initiative.



America's largest abortion provider and out-of-state interests are leading an effort to create a **right to late-pregnancy abortion** in the Nebraska Constitution.

Abortion activists, *Protect Our Rights Nebraska*, are gathering signatures to put a right to late-pregnancy abortion on the ballot in November of 2024. Nebraskans need to know how this proposal is dangerous, deceptive, and demeaning, and why it must be opposed.



1 DANGEROUS

- ✗ Fifty years of common-sense protections for women and girls against unsafe abortion practices would be eliminated, as illustrated by Michigan after they passed a similar initiative.
- ✗ Teenagers could access abortions without their parents' knowledge.
- ✗ It seeks to embed late-pregnancy abortion into the state constitution, despite evidence showing its high risks and trauma for women and girls.
- ✗ The legislature's ability to enact essential health and safety protections for moms and babies is jeopardized by the phrase "without interference of the state."

2 DECEPTIVE

- ✗ The pro-abortion amendment uses purposefully vague and abstract terms to drastically expand abortion in Nebraska.
- ✗ Terms like "viability" can be manipulated by abortionists and are defined so broadly that it will put healthy 2nd & 3rd-trimester babies at risk of being killed by abortion.
- ✗ Even babies who require basic neonatal health care could be categorized by an abortionist as not viable, and be aborted.
- ✗ Nebraska law already allows 1st-trimester abortion and provides exceptions for rape, incest, and the life of the mother, which is supported by over 60% of Nebraskans.

3 DEMEANING

- ✗ The abortion industry makes women feel afraid, isolated, and without options. This is at a time when trusted family, friends, churches, and Nebraskans want to support their pregnancy and parenting needs.
- ✗ The amendment is funded by out-of-state special interest groups, including America's largest abortion provider, which stands to profit financially from increased abortions in Nebraska.
- ✗ This proposal will create a culture that incentivizes and expects abortion rather than build a "culture of life" that seeks to fully support pregnant and parenting women, including those in the workplace.
