

### **Reminder Tidbits**

Every now and then it is a good idea to be reminded of certain basic standards by which we as disciples of Jesus are called to live. Consider this bulletin insert one of those occasions.

#### Summer

Because the summer is upon us, this time of year is appropriate to reflect on how we dress when attending Mass. As they say, if you don't know where you're going, any road will get you there. We do know where we're going in the sacrifice of the Mass: to give praise and worship to Our Maker and to receive His grace and blessing in the reception of His son Jesus in the Eucharistic sacrifice. God obliges us to this, not for His own sake but for ours. What could any one of us possibly add to the glory of God? Yet we gain superabundantly when we receive Him.

In reflecting on these truths the evidence is given that the way in which we come to Him in the sacrifice of His son makes a difference. How we approach Him in our hearts is manifested externally in our attitude, our posture, our dress. For this reason is the importance of considering how we come to Him, including but not limited to dressing well. This necessarily excludes clothing one might wear to the beach or a softball game, such as sweatpants, running shorts, flip-flop sandals, Budweiser t-shirts, and so on.

One might say, *Since God looks into the heart the external things don't matter*. This might be a point worth considering if our Lord himself didn't repeatedly contradict that view in his teaching that our behavior is an outward expression of what's in our hearts (cf., Mt.15:18-20, for example). In addition, our own behavior contradicts this view as well. Consider how we dress at weddings, funerals, retirement parties, anniversary banquets, and so on. Why do we dress this way at all the events of life that we consider so important? And therefore, what must be acknowledged is that in the eternal scheme of things, nothing is more important than our coming to God. Thus, how important our worship of Him at Mass is even in the way we dress.

### **Eucharistic Fast**

The universal law of the Church, found in the Code of Canon Law, indicates the following about the obligation to fast before receiving the Eucharist:

#919 One who is to receive the Most Holy Eucharist is to abstain from any food or drink, with the exception only of water and medicine, for at least the period of one hour before Holy Communion.

Of course, the reason for this regulation is to assist us in appreciating what it is we are about as we prepare to receive Our Lord Jesus in the Eucharist. Some would make the distinction that anything that does not have calories, like diet cola and sugar-free gum are also acceptable. According to the strict letter of the law, this is not the case. Only water and medicine are allowed with the one-hour fast. And the question of pop and gum itself raises attention to what we are about at Holy Mass.

### **Abstinence from Meat**

The universal law of the Church, found in the Code of Canon Law, indicates the following about the obligation to abstain from eating meat:

#1251 Abstinence from eating meat or another food according to the prescriptions of the conference of bishops is to be observed on Fridays throughout the year unless they are solemnities; abstinence and fast are to be observed on Ash Wednesday and on the Friday of the Passion and Death of Our Lord Jesus Christ.

Many people are surprised to hear of this regulation. Part of the reason for the confusion is that in 1966 the American Conference received permission to replace Friday abstinence with another type of penance. Prayer, visiting the sick, serving the aged, and other activities, are given as examples. You can find the documentation on the U.S. Conference of Bishops website at this url:

Of course, the reason for this regulation is that it serves as a reminder that Our Savior died on the Cross on Friday. This little penance we're called to offer helps us to remember that precious fact.

### Corpus Christi Procession Welcome the Sisters Community of Hope Open House Barbecue

June 2<sup>nd</sup> is a big day for our parish. It is our feast day since we celebrate Corpus Christi, the Body and Blood of Christ. On that day we have three events tied together:

- Eucharistic Procession. Weather permitting, we will have a walk through the neighborhood with Our Lord Jesus in a Eucharistic Procession. This will begin immediately following the 11:30 Mass. If you attend another Mass, you would be able to join the procession if you waited outside the front doors of the church at around 12:25. The journey will be not more than one mile, with three stops along the way. We will finish with Benediction in the Church, and proceed to the next event, which is....
- Welcome the School Sisters. A kind of "Open House" will be held on the new greenspace to meet and welcome the School Sisters of Christ the King, who will become an integral part of our school, beginning next year. This is an opportunity for you to introduce yourself and get to know the ones who will have a huge positive impact on our school life. In addition, also in attendance will be the sisters who will be running our Summer Catechetical program, which begins the following day, June 3<sup>rd</sup>.
- 3. <u>Community of Hope Open House</u>. The Building & Grounds Committee will be hosting an Open House. This will be your chance to take a closer look at all the great work that was accomplished through your generosity to the Community of Hope campaign. You will be able to see the work accomplished and ask questions of our members about our new greenspace, renovated school cafeteria and library, church and school roof replacements, school perimeter fencing and greenery.

While all this is happening, the Knights of Columbus are cordially hosting a hamburger cookout and ice cream.

# From May 27-30 the priests of the diocese will be attending a Convocation in Kearney. Here is a brief Q&A about what this means.

#### What is this Priest's Convocation?

A convocation, by definition, is a "calling together of a group of people." In this instance, Bishop Conley is "calling together" all the priests of the diocese of Lincoln.

#### What is the purpose of the Convocation?

The purpose is three-fold and is summed up well in the theme of the convocation, "Flourishing As Priests: Body, Mind, and Soul."

The convocation will offer daily talks to the priests on the theme of wellness and health: physical, spiritual, and social.

With all the priests at the convocations, will there be any opportunity for the lay faithful to attend daily Mass? Yes. Larger parishes will share a priest who will offer Mass and provide coverage for emergencies. The convocation begins on Monday afternoon (Memorial Day). Most parishes will probably have Mass that morning, as usual. Tuesday and Wednesday (May 28 and 29) will be full days at the convocation. There will still be Masses available in the larger parishes, but many of these will be consolidated with other parishes. We are hoping that the lay faithful, out of care for the priests assigned to serve them, will gladly go to Mass at a neighboring parish for just a couple of days. On Thursday, it will be up to each pastor as to whether he will offer a Mass upon his return home, or not.

# Will any priests be available for emergencies? How will I know which parish to call?

Yes. However, to free up as many of our priests as possible to attend the convocation, coverage will be spread out. For the days of the convocation, the diocese will set up ONE emergency number, to be used only from Monday Noon until Thursday at 3 pm of that week. We will then locate the nearest priest to respond to emergencies; this way people will not have to "hunt down" the nearest priest. Remember that the number will only be in operation

during the days of the convocation.

Here at Blessed Sacrament we will have the regular Masses on Monday morning, May 27, a visiting priest will be offering the 6:30 a.m. on Tuesday and Wednesday, and we're still working out Thursday's schedule. 
