



Corpus Christi Procession

June 2024

Main Work

Corpus Christi, the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, is celebrated with Eucharistic processions as a sign of faith, to adore and worship Jesus in His Body and Blood. To celebrate this day, Blessed Sacrament will hold a Eucharistic procession on Sunday, June 2 following the 11:30 a.m. mass.

Two years ago, on the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, Bishop James Conley presided at a holy hour and Vespers at Blessed Sacrament, marking the beginning of the national Eucharistic revival in the Diocese of Lincoln. The Eucharistic Revival is a three-year initiative to inspire, educate, and unite everyone in wonder and adoration of the True Presence of Jesus Christ in the sacrament of the Most Holy Eucharist.

Did You Know?

According to pillarcatholic.com, processions for Corpus Christi originated in Germany around 1275.

"The procession with the Blessed Sacrament...reminds us that we are called to go out and bring Jesus to others. To go out with enthusiasm, bringing Christ to those we meet in our daily lives."

- Pope Francis

By 1350, as the feast had become a universal practice, so too had the processions, during which a priest carries a consecrated host in a Eucharistic vessel, often covered by a canopy, with the faithful following.

How can you be involved?

Many of the parish groups, such as Knights of Columbus, Altar Society, and other come together to make the celebration happen. Even if you are not part of one of these groups, you and your family can participate simply by joining other parishioners on the journey around the neighborhood.

The Eucharistic procession is about one mile long and will include stops at three stations. At each station, the monstrance is placed on the altar, the celebrant kneels before the Blessed Sacrament and leads the faithful in prayers, a reading from the Gospels, and/or a brief period of silent adoration.

Impact in our Parish and Community

The procession through the neighborhood is designed to show those in the community our strong faith and commitment to the



Eucharist as the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity or our Lord Jesus Christ.

The procession is also an opportunity to invite parishioners to enter more deeply into parish life and help build the parish community.

Pope Francis said, "Being a disciple means being constantly ready to bring the love of Jesus to others, and this can happen unexpectedly and in any place: on the street, in a city square, during work, on a journey."

Explaining the Alternative Pro-Life Ballot Initiative.



Launched by medical professionals, the Protect Women & Children ballot initiative would amend the Nebraska state constitution to protect babies in the second and third trimesters. Their proposed language states:

"Except when a woman seeks an abortion necessitated by a medical emergency or when the pregnancy results from sexual assault or incest, unborn children shall be protected from abortion in the second and third trimester."



Protects Babies



Preborn babies would be constitutionally protected in the second and third trimesters.

The Nebraska Legislature could provide additional protections from abortion for women and babies.



Greater Possible

Legal and health-related safeguards would remain intact to protect women & children from unsafe and coercive abortion practices. These safeguards include informed consent, parental notification, and license & inspection requirements for abortion facilities.

America's largest abortion provider and out-of-state interests are leading an effort to create a right to late-pregnancy abortion in the Nebraska Constitution.

Abortion activists, *Protect Our Rights Nebraska*, are gathering signatures to put a right to late-pregnancy abortion on the ballot in November of 2024. Nebraskans need to know how this proposal is dangerous, deceptive, and demeaning, and why it must be opposed.





DANGEROUS



- X Fifty years of common-sense protections for women and girls against unsafe abortion practices would be eliminated, as illustrated by Michigan after they passed a similar initiative.
- X Teenagers could access abortions without their parents' knowledge.
- It seeks to embed late-pregnancy abortion into the state constitution, despite evidence showing its high risks and trauma for women and girls.
- The legislature's ability to enact essential health and safety protections for moms and babies is jeopardized by the phrase "without interference of the state."



DECEPTIVE



- The pro-abortion amendment uses purposefully vague and abstract terms to drastically expand abortion in Nebraska.
- Terms like "viability" can be manipulated by abortionists and are defined so broadly that it will put healthy 2nd & 3rd-trimester babies at risk of being killed by abortion.
- Even babies who require basic neonatal health care could be categorized by an abortionist as not viable, and be aborted.
- Nebraska law already allows 1st-trimester abortion and provides exceptions for rape, incest, and the life of the mother, which is supported by over 60% of Nebraskans.



- X The abortion industry makes women feel afraid, isolated, and without options. This is at a time when trusted family, friends, churches, and Nebraskans want to support their pregnancy and parenting needs.
- X The amendment is funded by out-of-state special interest groups, including America's largest abortion provider, which stands to profit financially from increased abortions in Nebraska.
- X This proposal will create a culture that incentivizes and expects abortion rather than build a "culture of life" that seeks to fully support pregnant and parenting women, including those in the workplace.
