

Call to Order and Opening Prayer

A Parish Council meeting was held on 9/25/24 at Blessed Sacrament School, beginning at 6:30 PM and moderated by Fr. Morin.

Reports

Building & Grounds - Fr. Morin Reporting

A master plan is being created for the Church grounds to make changes to the arrangement of trees and shrubs due to required movements, dead trees, and beautification ideas.

The Fall Festival this year will raise funds to make improvements to the north main entrance to the school, including new planters and benches.

<u>School – Jennifer Tran Reporting</u>

Final enrollment for the 2024-2025 school year is 145 students.

<u>Altar Society – Katie Kudron Reporting</u>

The new Eucharistic Procession canopy that was purchased jointly by the Altar Society and the Knights of Columbus was delivered and is in the process of being assembled.

Instead of meeting nine times a year, the Altar Society will now meet every other month.

The group is recruiting new members to join and hopes to increase membership this year.

Knights of Columbus - Clem Pella Reporting

The stadium seat fundraiser is ongoing.

There will be a breakfast for the community held on January 12th.

The tootsie roll drive will be in October.

Finance Council - Fr. Morin Reporting

The Community of Hope campaign is almost complete with most funds received and the incurred debt close to being paid off. A celebration will be planned for a weekend in December.

There will be a feasibility study completed to see if the parish can possibly expand the Pius X capital campaign, which begins in January, to include projects here at the parish.

Discussion Items

- A review of the previous decision to change hymnals was discussed by the Council and parish members present due to the racks on the backs of pews starting to break down with the inclusion of four hymnals and two missalettes. The parish facilities manager will investigate a possible replacement for the pew racks.
- The Church rental property at 2336 S. 17th will be sold as soon as possible. The current renters will move out in October and maintenance preparing for the sale has already been completed.
- Security cameras will be added around the Church property and structures to keep the school children and parishioners safe. Funds for this project have been secured by a grant.
- The members of the parish council will serve a Holy hour every other Sunday at 7:00 PM.
- A stewardship booklet produced by St. Peter's was passed around as an option to educate new and existing parishioners about the various opportunities for spiritual enrichment in the parish.
- A member of the parish asked the Council to consider saying the "O Sacrament Most Holy..." prayer after Masses given the tie to our parish name.
- The next Parish Council meeting will be November 27th, at 6:30 PM. The meeting adjourned around 7:15 PM followed by a closing prayer lead by Fr. Morin.

PROTECT THE RIGHT TO ABORTION

WOULD **REMOVE** CURRENT LIFE-AFFIRMING NEBRASKA LAWS.



1991 - Parental Notification

Requires at least one parent be notified before an abortion can be performed on a minor 17 years or younger.

1993 - Informed Consent

Requires that education on fetal development, information on pregnancy and childbirth services be provided to anyone seeking an abortion.

1997 - Ban on Partial-Birth Abortion

Prohibits the abortion procedure involving partial vaginal delivery of a living unborn child before killing and completing the delivery.

2002 - Assault on an Unborn Child Act

One who assaults a pregnant woman and causes serious injury to her unborn child would be charged with a Class I misdemeanor.

2004 - Homicide of Unborn Child Act

Manslaughter of an unborn child and 1st degree assault of an unborn child is reclassified as a IIA felony.

2009 - Mother's Right to See Her Unborn Child Ultrasound Law

Ensures a woman about to undergo an abortion has informed consent about the procedure, including display of the ultrasound screen.

2010 - Pain Capable Unborn Child Protection Act

Prohibits abortion after 20 weeks gestation, unless the mother's condition requires an abortion to prevent death or serious risks to major bodily functions.

2011 - Ban on Webcam Abortions

Ensures that every abortion, whether chemical or surgical, is done by a liscensed physician physically present in the room of the active procedure.

2011 - Parental Consent

Requires minors to provide notarized proof of consent from at least one legal guardian before an abortion can be performed.

2017 - Compassionate Care for Medically Challenging Pregnancies Act

Ensures that doctors fully equip women with information on perinatal hospice care at the time of a diagnosis.

2018 - Ending Taxpayer Funding of Abortion

Ensures that state Title X funding is not available to agencies who provided and referred for abortion services.

2018 - Non-viable Birth Certificates for Miscarried Children

Provides commemorative certificates to mothers who miscarry prior to the 20th week of pregnancy.

2019 - Ban on Dismemberment Abortion

Bans the use of an abortion process known as Dilation and Evacuation (D&E) where the unborn is removed through dismemberment.

2019 - Abortion Reversal Pill Act

Requires doctors to inform women on how to reverse the abortion pill when prescribed.

2023 - Preborn Child Protection Act

Offers protections to children at 12 weeks gestation in the state of Nebraska.

2024 - Create the Nebraska Prenatal Plus Program

Covers the cost of prenatal services for pregnant women who are determined to be at risk for negative maternal or infant health outcomes.

2024 - Expanding the Nebraska Newborn Safe Haven Act

The Safe Haven Act Law now allows parents to call 911 to safely surrender their infant (from 30 days to 3 months old) to emergency personnel.








