

The obligation for Sunday is fulfilled by any Mass Saturday evening through Sunday night. The obligation for the Holy Day is fulfilled by any Mass Sunday evening through Monday night.

In other words, a Catholic could attend Mass Sunday morning & have all the prayers & readings for the Second Sunday of Advent and fulfill their Sunday obligation, then go to Mass that evening (which would have all the prayers and readings for, again the Second Sunday of Advent) and fulfill their obligation for the

Immaculate Conception. Or of course you can go to Mass either on the evening of Sat., Dec. 7th or Sun., Dec. 8th & then Mass on Mon., Dec. 9th and fulfill both obligations that way. To read more scan the QR code. No matter what the combination though, every Catholic is obliged to attend Mass for the Second Sunday of Avent & for the Immaculate Conception.

Call to Order and Opening Prayer

A parish council meeting of Blessed Sacrament Church was held on 11/27/24 at Blessed Sacrament School, beginning at 6:00 PM and moderated by Bob Svoboda.

Members present: Collin Aldrich, Katie Kudron, Fr. Morin, Clem Pella, Jennifer Tran, Ben Mattern, Aaron May, Mike Muff, Bob Svoboda, Perry Demma, Chris Beardslee, and Hai Tran.

Members absent: Matt Richardson and Fr. Reimers

Reports

- Building & Grounds Chris Beardslee Reporting
 - $\circ \quad \mbox{A comprehensive landscape plan is in progress.}$
 - \circ $\,$ $\,$ Drainage improvements are planned for the east side of the Church.
 - \circ ~ Fall Festival funds will improve the school entryway; plans are in progress.
 - Water has been leaking into the Church basement during the last few rains; each time, improvements are made and will continue until the leaking stops.
 - The City of Lincoln sent notice that the Church owned property to the East of the rectory has lead piping from the water main and the City will be replacing it at some time in the future at the City's cost.
 - The rental property at 2336 S. 17th St. is still being upgraded and a decision will be made soon on when to sell and what the price may be.
- <u>School Jennifer Tran Reporting</u>
 - \circ $\;$ Enrollment is up by two this year and there will be 22+ in kindergarten next year.
 - Recruiting to increase enrollment will begin soon with an e-mail sent to Pre-K eligible parishioners. Testimonials from some public-school transfers that have experienced positive transformation will be used in efforts.
 - The Pre-K para left and a replacement one was promoted from part-time to full-time.
 - \$35K-\$45K in annual scholarships from Opportunity Scholarship Nebraska will be awarded to help lower income families with tuition.
- <u>Altar Society Katie Kudron Reporting</u>
 - The new Eucharistic canopy that was purchased jointly by the Altar Society and the Knights of Columbus is being assembled with some difficulty.
 - Upcoming events include a 12/13 Christmas party and 12/15 bake sale.
- <u>Knights of Columbus Clem Pella Reporting</u>
 - Upcoming events include a 12/14 Christmas party, 1/11/25 Sloppy Joe dinner, 1/12/25 breakfast burritos, and the annual free throw contest in January.
- Finance Council Fr. Morin Reporting
 - Through the first three months of the fiscal year, Sunday giving is down significantly. Work is underway to try to find why contributions don't seem to be matching commitments made through the Stewardship Offertory Program.

Other Discussion Items

- Fr. Morin presented Unbound, which advocates and supports parishes to tithe to poor parishes around the world. The parish council will pray for direction regarding how to respond to this opportunity to help those in need.
- The Pius X capital campaign was pushed back to August of 2025 to allow for further planning. Blessed Sacrament's contribution currently stands at around \$830K and a joint campaign to continue updates at Blessed Sacrament will be considered.
- The Community of Hope campaign is coming to a close and Blessed Sacrament has already paid off all of its debt! It is believed that this is the first time the parish has been debt free in almost 40 years! An invitation to Bishop Conley has been extended to join us for a loan documentation burning celebration and green space blessing soon.
- The parish will potentially be giving away a book at Christmas time; it will be a surprise!
- Multiple parishioners have independently asked Fr. Morin to bring back Sunday adoration like we were doing during the year of the Eucharist. The possibility will be explored since multiple parish organizations need to step up to make it happen.
- The parish council took a field trip to see a potential solution to having too many books in the back of pews. A sample of a solution was installed that would hold all books and would cost approximately \$5K to install throughout the sanctuary.
- The next parish council meeting will be January 22^{nd} , at 6:30 PM.
- The meeting adjourned around 7:03 PM followed by a closing prayer led by Fr. Morin.

Parish Council of Catholic Women (aka Altar Society)

December 2024

Main Work

The Parish Council of Catholic Women (PCCW), also know as the Altar Society, is a service organization responsible for many "behind the scenes" tasks in the parish. They launder the Altar linens and cassocks, maintain the votive candles in the Church, and take care of the Marian Garden. One significant part of the PCCW is providing luncheons for funerals in the parish. Some ladies provide salads and desserts for the meal, while others are responsible for actually serving the meal for the family and friends of the deceased. In this way, the group is helping with both the Corporal works of mercy of burying the dead and feeding the hungry! But the group is not entirely about service. The PCCW desires to help foster the spiritual life through prayer at meetings and sharing a Sunday Holy Hour, as well as the fellowship of the members through quarterly socials.

Did You Know?

PCCW has multiple bake sales each year. Their biggest fundraiser is the upcoming Homemade Christmas Bake Sale on Sunday, December 15. The funds raised by PCCW help with purchases such as altar wine, hosts, and candles. In the past few years, they have made multiple large purchases, including the holy water fonts, a thurible, and new cassocks and surplices. Most

recently, the Knights of Columbus and the PCCW worked together to purchase a canopy for the Eucharistic Processions.

How can you be involved?

All women in the parish are automatically members of the PCCW, whether they are active or not. But there is always a need for more ladies to become active. This can be as simple as providing desserts for a bake sale, or helping to maintain the votive candles in the Church. Ladies can participate however their time or talents allow.

The Altar Society meets bi-monthly (the 4th Tuesday of odd-numbered months), so the meetings are not a big time commitment. Last year, the PCCW averaged over 65 hours a month in service, spiritual, and social activities!



Impact in our Parish and Community

Lois Korinek has been a member of PCCW for many years and shared, "I have so enjoyed being a member of the Altar Society. Years ago when my children were young, it was a night out that I not only could connect with my friends, but also pray together and above all feel that I was contributing to helping with all the needs of the altar and of the Church. In looking back, I feel that from my being a member, that I have received more than what I have given."
