

## **Practical Reminders**

Every now and then it is a good idea to be reminded of certain basic standards by which we as disciples of Jesus are called to live, particularly when we gather as one to worship. Consider this bulletin insert one of those occasions.

#### **Children at Mass**

When looking at the congregation at Mass on Sunday, it is very striking how many growing families we have in our parish. We are very blessed! We are so blessed in fact that the resulting noise and commotion can become a distraction, for those of us on the altar, as well as other members in the congregation that might find it difficult to hear, pay attention to Mass or to pray.

While there are many different parenting styles for all kinds of families, all of us need to be conscious of our fellow parishioners and their need for a quiet space for prayer and Mass. Everyone is welcome and should be able to come worship, but being part of a community requires all of us to be patient and understanding of each other. Babies and toddlers are going to make noise in Church. That is very normal. Parents play a pivotal role in ensuring that noise remains respectful of the fact we are in church, to worship and pray as a community.

There are plenty of approaches to teaching children how to behave appropriately. Even toddlers are capable of learning how to be quiet and respectful when they enter Church.

- Setting expectations before walking into Church is a good starting point. Explain that people come to Mass for the quiet and to be able to pray.
- Some children might do better closer to the altar so they are able to see what is happening. And if needed, the pews near the front are close to an easy exit!
- Engaging with your child, holding them close, whispering and explaining what is happening might impress upon them the solemness of the Mass.
- While ignoring some behaviors can be an effective approach at home, it doesn't work so well in church. You may need to engage (disrupting your own prayer time) to enforce quiet, respectful behavior.
- You and your spouse might consider "divide and conquer". It isn't actually fair that one spouse is busy struggling with the kids, while the other spouse is enraptured in the Mass.
- Worst case, your child may need a short break. Leaving Mass doesn't need to be seen as a punishment, but it also shouldn't become a reward or recess time in the vestibule.
- One final approach -- alternating Mass times with your spouse. This might give both of you a chance to relax quietly and engage in the holy sacrifice of the Mass until your child is school age and ready to go to daily Mass with his/her classmates.

These are just a few suggestions. Don't get discouraged! You are doing a great job bringing your children to God. God has blessed you (and our parish) with children. They are a wonderful gift. Teaching respectful behaviors isn't easy but the important lessons our children need never are.

# The Precepts of the Church

(From the Catechism of the Catholic Church, #2041-43) 2041 The precepts of the Church are set in the context of a moral life bound to and nourished by liturgical life. The obligatory character of these positive laws decreed by the pastoral authorities is meant to guarantee to the faithful the very necessary minimum in the spirit of prayer and moral effort, in the growth in love of God and neighbor (emphasis added): 2042

The first precept ("You shall attend Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation and rest from servile labor") requires the faithful to sanctify the day commemorating the Resurrection of the Lord as well as the principal liturgical feasts honoring the mysteries of the Lord, the Blessed Virgin Mary, and the saints; in the first place, by participating in the Eucharistic celebration, in which the Christian community is gathered, and by resting from those works and activities which could impede such a sanctification of these days. (cf. Rom.12:8,11)

The second precept ("You shall confess your sins at least once a year") ensures preparation for the Eucharist by the reception of the sacrament of reconciliation, which continues Baptism's work of conversion and forgiveness.

The third precept ("You shall receive the sacrament of the Eucharist at least during the Easter season") guarantees as a minimum the reception of the Lord's Body and Blood in connection with the Paschal feasts, the origin and center of the Christian liturgy. 2043

The fourth precept ("You shall observe the days of fasting and abstinence established by the Church") ensures the times of ascesis and penance which prepare us for the liturgical feasts and help us acquire mastery over our instincts and freedom of heart.

The fifth precept ("You shall help to provide for the needs of the Church") means that the faithful are obliged to assist with the material needs of the Church, each according to his own ability.
