Call to Order and Opening Prayer

- A parish council meeting of Blessed Sacrament Church was held on 7/23/2025 at Blessed Sacrament School, beginning at 6:02 PM.
- Members present: Collin Aldrich, Chris Beardslee, Jason Danner, Katie Kudron, Ben Mattern, Fr. Morin, Clem Pella.
- Members absent: Perry Demma, Jennifer Ramaekers, Fr. Reimers, Matt Richardson, Hai Tran.
- Council Status Sr. Marie Caritas Deras, the new Blessed Sacrament School Principal, will not be able to attend Parish Council meetings, but will instead publish news and notes in the Church bulletin monthly.

Building & Grounds - Chris Beardslee Reporting

- A project to replace the planters in the school courtyard will begin in October. The planters will be larger with built-in drainage.
- Estimates for replacing the rectory roof will be sought in the coming months.
- A contract to improve exterior lighting for the Church and school was recently signed with work slated to begin in the next 6-8
 weeks. The new lighting is "dark sky" approved and will cover the parking lot, east and north sides of the school, and the front of
 the Church.

Altar Society - Katie Kudron Reporting

- The adult women's retreat sponsored by The Altar Society on July 19th was attended by over 130 women, with approximately 20 from Blessed Sacrament.
- The Altar Society will be purchasing a new monstrance with a 5 1/4" opening for a larger host. The old monstrance will be used for processions while the new one will be used for exposition in the Church.

Knights of Columbus - Jason Danner and Clem Pella Reporting

- The Knights continue to work concessions during Saltdogs games to raise money to support Parish programs.
- Council officers were recently installed to begin the 2nd of consecutive one-year terms.
- August 10th is the Walk for Hunger.
- Blessed Father Michael McGivney, founder of the Knights, will be honored on August 13th.
- Recruitment activities will take place after Masses on August 23rd and 24th.

Finance Council - Fr. Morin Reporting

- The finance council approved a revision to the Church and School budget, which was after the Parish Council gave final approval. Errors were discovered and corrected, but the budget is still balanced.
- The Parish Council reviewed the plan for the upcoming parish capital campaign to complete Church projects and fund Blessed Sacrament's portion of the Pius X Fundraising Campaign. The Church projects will be centered on a refresh of the Sanctuary, which has not been updated since the beautiful renovation in 2001.

Liturgy - Fr. Morin Reporting

- Several members of the Parish Council hope to partner with The Hope of the Poor Mission to participate in a Missionary trip to Mexico City. For the evaluative trip, the group will join members of a Lincoln Diocese Parish that has been going on this mission for several years. If the Mission trip is successful, future trips will be organized for other members of the Parish.
- The two remaining events to celebrate Blessed Sacraments 75th anniversary are still being planned with a special 40 hours of devotion and pilgrimage being scheduled.
- Prayer and financial support were requested by the prison ministry in Lincoln. The ministry has long been led by Fr. Kubat but is transitioning to a lay person going forward.

Other Discussion Items

- The council discussed ways to notify parishioners when members pass away, since many times the only notification mentioned is during prayer intentions offered at Mass. It was decided that awill be posted to honor those "in memorium". The notifications will be published for 2-3 weeks each and may include general information about the recently deceased.
- The Parish Council voted unanimously to include incense at all Masses when the Priest desires its use; however, at the 8:30 AM Mass, the Incense will not be used in the opening procession and only used at the Altar. Please contact Fr. Morin with any concerns.
- Fr. Morin again requested ideas for filling many volunteer positions within the Church. There are several positions that were filled by long-term volunteers that need support due to health issues or retirements. Examples of need include helping the decorating committee, Acolytes, growing the Altar Society membership, perpetual adoration (more openings are being created than being filled), SCRIP auditor, stewardship committee, and weed control. Grab a friend to volunteer together; many hands make light work! If you are interested in getting involved, there are many opportunities; please contact the Parish Offices.
- The Parish Council elections process will begin in October to replace open positions that are coming to an end.
- The next Parish Council meeting will be Wednesday, September 24th at 6:00 PM.
- The meeting adjourned around 6:59 PM followed by a closing prayer led by Fr. Morin.
