

ATTENTION - REMINDER – GOOD FRIDAY - A Day of Fast & Abstinence. A genuflection, made by bending the right knee to the ground, signifies adoration, and therefore it is reserved for the Most Blessed Sacrament, as well as for the Holy Cross from the solemn adoration during the liturgical celebration on Good Friday until the beginning of the Easter Vigil. At the Good Friday celebration, you will notice the priest and ministers will genuflect when they leave, even though the tabernacle will be empty at that time. They will be genuflecting to

the Cross in the sanctuary.

At the Easter Vigil the priest solemnly blesses the baptismal font where the catechumens (unbaptized Church) are baptized. It is a rather long blessing that recalls the many saving acts of God that were accomplished through water. It is a powerful prayer, but the graces are not only reserved for those to be baptized. It is an ancient custom for priests to bless, in addition to the baptismal font, several gallons of water to be distributed to the faithful.

adults who want to be admitted into the Catholic

Holy water is a special sacramental in the Church with great importance in the spiritual realm. Saint Teresa of Avila recalls in her autobiography the power she experienced when using holy water to expel demons. "I have found by experience that there is nothing from which the devils fly more quickly than from holy water. They also fly from the cross, but they return almost immediately. Certainly, the power of holy water must be great; for my part, my soul feels particular comfort in taking it, and very generally a refreshment and interior delight which I cannot express."

and is meant to remind us of the need to spiritually cleanse ourselves of sin. This is why holy water is used throughout the Easter season, especially on Sundays when the priest sprinkles the people with that same Easter water. As we often sing while the priest blesses us with water, "Sprinkle me with hyssop, O Lord, and I shall be cleansed; wash me and I shall be whiter than snow."
