CCD CATECHISTS NEEDED FOR FALL

The 2019-20 CCD Religious Education year was very successful thanks to the great team of volunteer Catechists who served our parish by instructing CCD classes. But sadly, Aleta Buckles & Julie Main will not be returning for the 2020-21 religious education year. We are grateful for their many years of service to the Parish in the CCD Program & wish them joy & happiness in all their future endeavors.

The CCD program is in need of Catechists to fill the following vacancies for the upcoming 2020-21 religious education term:

- ◆ 1st grade – secondary instructor
- ◆ 5th grade – lead & secondary instructor. This is our Sacramental Confirmation Prep grade level class.
- ◆ 7/8th grade – secondary instructor
- ◆ CCD Program Co-Coordinator

The word Catechist means “one that catechizes.” It is a derivative of the word Catechesis which means to “echo.” A catechist then is one who echoes the Word of God & passes on the Catholic tradition & teachings. But a catechist is much more than just a teacher who shares factual knowledge; a catechist is one who is commissioned by the parish community to help in the faith formation of children & spread the Good News of Jesus Christ. A catechist is a mentor, witness, faith sharer, & model in the Christian way of life.

All parishioners are invited to open your hearts to the children of our parish. Please consider assisting the CCD program by volunteering your time & talent as an instructor with the program.

This is a commitment of 1.5 hours on Wednesday nights & approximately 2 hours prep time each week. Our goal is to have at least 2 instructors per grade level to share the instructional time and/or duties. All instructional
